WA College of Agriculture at Morawa is a highly regarded Independent Public School which enrolls students from across Western Australia to study specialised Agriculture courses and trade certificates while living in a modern Residential Boarding facility. WACOA Morawa is located in the Northern Wheatbelt on a broadacre grain growing property with specialised cattle, pig and sheep enterprises.

Entry to the WACOA Morawa is gained through the successful completion of a trial, followed by an interview of student applicant and parent/guardian/caregiver with the Principal. Following the Principals recommendation for acceptance, a \$300 deposit is paid to reserve the position and enrolment completed.

Not every student will be accepted.

Entry is according to

1. Demonstrated interest in agriculture, automotive and engineering or related trades
2. School Behaviour Record – from current school
3. Academic Report – most recent
4. Confidential reference from current school administration – phone or written
5. Medical History – being open and transparent
6. Social and Emotional Health – being open and transparent
7. Level of support from parent/guardian/carer

Further to the above priority will be given to:

1. Isolated students who cannot access secondary agricultural education locally

Further to the above priority may be given to:

1. Year 11 enrolment over Year 10

There will be:

1. No religious, cultural or racial bias
2. No gender bias except when Residential Boarding space is a limiting factor

Morawa District High School Residential Boarding – Residential beds are available for District High School Boarders who may or may not attend the WA College of Agriculture Morawa in subsequent years. The number of Residential beds allocated to Morawa DHS is directly dependent on College Boarding numbers, ie WACOA Morawa students will be given priority.

Morawa DHS Boarding places are allocated according to:

1. Behaviour Record
2. Residential compatibility
3. Medical History – being open and transparent
4. Social and Emotional Health – being open and transparent
5. Level of support from parent/guardian/carer
